Ela Kielich you can now abbreviate your Phal. (Brother Stage x Brother Lawrence) x Brother Lawrence to Phal. Lawrence of Arabia x Brother Lawrence. This cross has not yet been registered.

Orchid Judging/Appreciation Course

This year, commencing in March, the Orchid Society of NSW judging panel will commence a new orchid appreciation/judging course. The course will have an initial meeting on the 15th March to explain what the course entails and will commence at 7.30pm and end at 10.00pm and will be held at the Berala Community Centre, 2-4 Tilba St Berala. The course will be held on the 2nd Friday of each month except for December ending in 2021. The course is intended for all those who are interested in developing their knowledge of orchids and are keen to learn about the standards set for orchid judging and what the judges look for when they award prizes at our shows. The course is especially good for positions like Show Marshals and of course, for our prospective judges of the future. The initial meeting on March 15th will be an information one, where you will learn what the course involve. After that, the sessions will be conducted by our experienced judges who each will present a different group of orchids for your learning experience. A one off payment of \$50.00 should be made at the commencement of the course. NORTH SHORE'S AGM in MARCH

At the March meeting, North Shore will hold its annual AGM and auction night and we are looking for members to come on our committee. Janelle will be stepping down as President so we need a new President and Vice President and we also need some new general committee members. PLEASE consider coming onto our committee; it is not a difficult job as all it entails is attending one committee meeting between our monthly meetings.



Pointers from Seong Tay's talk on repotting your Paphiopedilums

- 1. It is preferable to water your plants a couple of days before repotting so that they are well hydrated and able to stand the stress of repotting.
- 2. Preferred time to repot is when the new growths are starting to appear or soon after flowering, but be careful as they can be easily knocked off.
- 3. Remove plant gently from old pot and remove old potting mix from roots.
- 4. Remove dead roots only, do not cut healthy roots as there is some evidence that Paph roots do not regenerate.
- 5. Select pot size by size of root ball, Seong likes to pot in clear pots to see root growth.
- 6. Repot Paphs slightly lower in the pot as new growths tend to be higher than old plant.
- 7. Always use a face mask when potting with perlite as the dry dust is dangerous when inhaled.
- 8. Water thoroughly after repotting if dry potting mix is used. Water again in 2 to 3 days time, then normal watering frequency. Do not allow potting mix to dry out completely. Clear pots allow you to assess when to water.

Seong's potting mix is:

3 parts Orchiata bark (small or medium depending on size of plant)

1 part Sel-Grit (limestone grit)

1 part fine perlite.

You can sprinkle a small amount of Dynamic Lifter on the surface of the pot so it is fertilized every time it is watered.

Pointers from Garrie Bromley's talk on repotting your Cattleyas

- 1. It is preferable to water your plants the day before repotting.
- 2. Preferred time to repot is when the new roots are approximately 1mm long (very short).
- 3. Remove plant from old pot and remove old potting mix and any old roots (ones that are hollow and soft) then if needed, cut the remaining roots to fit into the new pot as cattleya roots will regenerate.



- 4. Select front growths with a minimum of 3, preferably 4, pseudobulbs and select pot size to accommodate new growths for next two years.
- 5. Pot orchids so growth eyes are not covered and if using Peat and Perlite mix cover the top of the mix with small stones so that the mix will not be washed away when watering.
- 6. Stake plants securely so that new roots are held in place firmly and do not move.
- 7. Always use a face mask when potting with perlite as the dry dust is dangerous.

Garrie's potting mix is:

6 parts perlite (either Jumbo or Super Coarse)

2 parts granulated foam

1 part good quality peat moss

or

3 parts Kiwi bark

1 part perlite

You can sprinkle a small amount of dolomite on the surface of the mix, then water in.
