
No Guest Speaker This month we have our AGM so do think of coming on the committee, we always need new committee members. If you want to talk about what is involved please call any of the committee and have a talk.

How to make your own crumbed polystyrene

These days orchid growers are regularly using crumbed polystyrene in their mixes and acquiring it has proved a challenge for many members. Last week while visiting Royale Orchids we witnessed how they make their own from any polystyrene that they have, whether it is in sheet form or just packaging to keep things that are delivered safely. The photos explain the simple technique used; all you need is a wire tray to fit over a plastic tub.

Encyclia Orchids a few notes after hours of research by Lesley

Encyclia is a genus of orchids that come from the southern United States, through Mexico and South America all the way to Argentina. In 1997, Higgins established the genus *Prosthechea*, moving many former *Encyclia* species into this group as a further attempt to classify this group. They are closely related to other *Cattleya* alliance orchids and are readily crossed with them to make hybrids that while not a full filled in flat shape, they do have lovely sprays of open flat flowers on upright stems, which last well.

Encyclias are extremely variable and range in size from 5 cms plants up to pseudobulbs the size of softballs with leaves 60 cms or more in length. In spite of this variability, they all share the common feature of a lip that, while not fused to the column, more or less enfolds it. Some species have unusual-looking upside down flowers with lips pointing up, resembling octopus such as famous Encyclia cochleata. Encyclias flowers are lovely and may come in different colours, shapes and many of them are fairly scented. For instance, pink-flowered cultivars of Encyclia cordigera have lovely roses scent, Encyclia fragrans smells like a mix of honey and vanilla, and Encyclia osmantha smells like grapes. There are approximately 160 species of Encyclias. They typically have thick, rounded pseudobulbs rather like onions with two to three leaves emerge from the top of the pseudobulbs Potting Mix; It's important to choose a potting mix that will dry out quickly after each watering, such as coarse bark, as they prefer to dry out between watering. Also they will dry out more quickly if you avoid using a too large pot; keep them a bit pot-bound.

<u>Lighting</u>: Encyclias like good light and can even cope with direct sunlight if acclimatized slowly.

<u>Watering</u>: These are plants that prefer to stay rather dry although they do seem to like high humidity. The best potting mix for Encyclia orchid growing should be open and well-drained. They expect a dry rest in winter, when they receive less water; increase watering somewhat when new growth starts. After seeing some of the places in Garrie's photos of where they found Encyclias, they do seem to grow in what we would consider harsh conditions; maybe we do mollycoddle them too much.

<u>Temperature</u> Encyclia orchids prefer cool to warm temperatures, and then some of them prefer warm to hot, but most of them go fairly well intermediate temperatures.

Remember the above information is not hard and fast rules. You need to to grow to your own conditions; this is just additional information.
