NSOS President's Report
Annual General Meeting on 6 March 2019

It's been my honour and privilege to lead the North Shore Orchid Society (NSOS) as President this past year. I'm a relatively new member of the society (one decade, I think) and by taking up this role I've come to know many more members and become familiar with what's involved in keeping a society like this going.

At the heart of the NSOS is the very hard-working committee who met monthly to plan the shows, organise the monthly meetings with speakers etc, deal with correspondence and all financial matters including renewal and new memberships. To top this off they organised and hosted our Christmas party – a wonderful celebration for 120 attendees. On behalf of all members I thank them for their dedication and commitment which has resulted in another successful year.

As usual the society conducted 12 monthly meetings at the Dougherty Centre where members socialised and stay connected and informed about past and upcoming shows and activities. We had an excellent series of culture classes and guest speakers where we learned about growing techniques and orchid biodiversity. Consequently, monthly plant benching was of an exceptionally high standard and many members are now progressing through the categories as their skill levels improve. I believe our society's greatest asset is our ability to learn from each other. We are fortunate to have presenters and judges who willingly share their expertise and explain what constitutes excellence. Congratulations to all contributors and prize winners and a big thank you to our conscientious judges and presenters.

Many members helped out on meeting nights – with the set-up, catering, library loans, orchid supplies and raffle sales etc. Our two auctions during the year and the regular monthly raffles gave us all the opportunity to refresh our personal orchid collections. Members of the public could also buy and see spectacular orchids at the many shows we're involved in and around Sydney.

I asked Garrie Bromley, our Show Marshall, to provide a report on our 2018 show year. He says our medium-sized display (no plant sales) for the Mother's Day week (in May) and our Spring Show (in September) at the St. Ives Shopping Village were well-received by management & public alike. We also put on our usual large display at the Gordon Centre in June. In August we had the St. Ives Orchid Fair with a breathtaking display at the entrance to the Display Hall. Six of our plants were champions including Grand Champion & Reserve Champion and there were lots of firsts & seconds.

In addition to these four shows, in July we contributed to the 21st Australian Orchid Council Conference which was held in South Windsor. We mounted a very large 4m x 4m display and our society members won several awards including two plant champions and quite a few firsts and seconds. A big thank you to the setup team and all others who contributed to our show schedule.

Between meetings, members were kept informed about the society's activities through the wonderful newsletter skilfully put together by Lesley Bromley. Trevor Walshe, our webmaster, also revamped [our website](#) to a more contemporary format and it is now attracting new members.

Our activities and membership fees keep the society financially sound. This enables us to have a social conscience and the society donates \$1000 annually to a worthy charity. This year we supported the [Big Red Kidney Bus](#) and will now give support to [Bear Cottage](#) a palliative care residence for children in Manly. Due to extensive travel planned for 2019 I am stepping down as President but encourage every member to become actively involved in the NSOS as what the society is, and becomes, is a reflection of its membership.
