We have had a request for members to have their name on their plants, either on the pots or with a name on a tag in the pot, so that owners can be easily identified.



'SALLY' THE COCKER SPANIEL DETECTS RARE NATIVE ORCHID IN KU-RING-GAI

A black cocker spaniel named Sally will lead the effort to find the rare Eastern Australian



Underground Orchid in locations of Ku-ring-gai. A location in the Ku-ring-gai area is where a rare Eastern Australian Underground Orchid Rhizanthella slateri has already been discovered is being kept as a closely guarded secret. The orchid is only known to grow in a handful of areas in NSW including Bulahdelah, the Blue Mountains and Nowra.


One of the striking features of this very rare native orchid species is its ability to burrow underground and move slowly through soil. The orchid's flower spike penetrates the soil surface for a few weeks each year, possibly to attract small flies searching for somewhere to lay eggs. In an attempt to locate other specimens of the orchid in Ku-ring-gai, Council staff are teaming up

with NSW Department of Planning Infrastructure and Environment researchers, who will use the specially trained detection dog, 'Sally', to locate the orchid.

Sally's tracking skills were previously used to find the noxious plant hawkweed in the Kosciusko National Park.

Mayor **Jennifer Anderson** said, "It is yet more proof of Ku-ring-gai's quite unique natural environment, considering we are a large urban council area in the middle of Sydney." The Mayor added that tracking would begin next week and if findings were promising, the research would be extended in the local area.
