This orchid is a real eye opener when in full flower, below are the two main orchids ( Den. bigibbum x phalaenopsis) used in the breeding of this plant.
Not all Enobi Purple orchids have splash petals and it does not always come through when it is cloned. So if you want a splash petal you need to buy a piece of known splash petal plant or one in flower.

Phal. pulcherrima var alba

Phalaenopsis pulcherrima formally known as Doritis pulcherrima come from the south east area of Asia, including north east India, Myanmar, Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam, Malaysia, Sumatra and Borneo. They are hardy little plants that grow either on rocks as lithophytes or in the organic leaf litter as terrestrials. They grow at low elevations so like some warmth and in shady areas of the forest. They like a potting medium that drains well and enjoy good air movement. They have very erect flower spikes that can often have up to 10 flowers open at once.

The colour can vary from white to dark purple and there are many perloric forms in all colours. They all like a regular feed of any good fertilizer and the only problem that we have with them is mealy bugs which can be easily controlled.

<u>Dendrobium Topaz Dream</u> is an Australian Hybrid which is starting to flower now and we will see on the show benches for the next month or two. It comprises of almost 94% *Den. bigibbum* and 6% *Den. canaliculatum*. At this time of the year when we have few Australian orchids on the bench this dendrobium makes a wonderful display. By going back one generation, you have *Den.* Fantasy Land which is one of the parents of

Topaz Dream crossed onto *Den. bigibbum*. The only difference between these two orchids is the percentage of *Den. bigibbum*, which is approx. 8%, but what a difference.
